STEP 1:

Complete the online application form at www.estonia.dreamapply.com

STEP 2:

Upload the following documents:

- Diploma of bachelor's degree and its academic transcripts (both in original language and their English translations); or the latest academic transcripts in case the final documents are not yet available
- Verification of English language competence: copy of TOEFL, IELTS test or Cambridge English exams (CAE, CPE).
Minimum requirements:
IELTS (Academic) min 6.5 with 5.5 or above in each element
TOEFL iBT min 79 or computer-based 213
CAE/CPE: A or B
- 1 passport-sized photo
- Motivation letter and portfolio

STEP 3:

Pay the non-refundable application fee of €100 and upload the receipt.

Preliminary evaluation and further guidance will be provided within 3 working days. Admission results will be announced on 1 June at the latest.

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KEY FEATURES

- Rethinking European Cities: the tremendous transformation of the European city requires individuals who are able to perceive things in association, as team-generalists.
- International education: the programme is a unique approach to research based education; it combines the idea of the classical artist journey with the interdisciplinary, project-orientated workshop tradition and teamwork, studio work and excursions.
- The two-year training consists of 11 workshops + the Master's Thesis, and it takes place at 6 different universities in Tallinn, Lisbon, Haifa, Berlin-Dessau, Innsbruck and Ljubljana.

PHILOSOPHY

What are the relevant fields today in terms of rethinking cities beyond the limits of growth? How do phenomena such as de-industrialisation, touristification or the never-ending urban sprawl affect the challenges of architects? And: How do we generate site-specific solutions in a socially responsible mind-set, together with students, professors and local experts?

All European metropolitan areas have to rethink and transform neglected districts. The project-orientated workshop sequence focus on open research questions like heritage transformation, tourism developments or new perspectives for industrial areas out of function, modular settlements in state of repair, devastated landscapes of exploitation and lost spaces.

Students will work together with local experts and professors in 6 countries of wider Europe. They will be immersed in different strategies of research through design & design thinking, in order to experience the complexity of cultural attitudes toward architecture and urban design.

FUTURE CAREER OPTIONS

The international programme prepares students for the wide range of professional requirements as a leading team generalist today: intensive and interdisciplinary research work about multi-faceted strategies to solve design tasks within rigorous limits, as well as their communication and visualisation, exercised with an international network of experts embody substantial skills for a top leadership role in the professional field.

The participation in multi-disciplinary investigations about living cultures and political conditions of urban planning will enrich the pan-European architectural discourse, thereby reinforcing the sense of responsibility, vision and capabilities among students – as needed skills within international working contexts. The graduates are competent to continue their studies to PhD level.

STRUCTURE OF THE CURRICULUM

The curriculum is composed of a sequence of 8 project workshops, 3 design reflection workshops and the Master's Thesis lasting 5 months.

VISA AND TEMPORARY RESIDENCE PERMIT

All foreigners coming to Estonia for the purpose of studies must obtain a right of residence for the duration of their studies.

■ EU Students: must register their place of residence in the City District Government office, and then apply for an ID-Card

■ NON-EU students: must apply for Temporary Residence Permit (TRP) either in the closest Estonian consulate or in Estonia within one month of arrival, if arriving with a visa.

ACCOMMODATION

■ On campus accommodation in TUT – rent per person in a twin room in the dormitory is around €125 per month.

■ Private rooms and apartments for rent in Tallinn – prices depend on the apartment, its location and size, staying generally between €200-400 per month + utilities.

■ In the 5 following cities – Haifa, Ljubljana, Berlin-Dessau and Lisbon, the prices depend on the apartment and its location and size, staying generally between €250-450 per month.

LIVING EXPENSES

The cost of living in Estonia, compared to the rest of the EU, is rather affordable. The average monthly expenses for international students, including accommodation, transport, food and other expenses amounts to around €500 a month. For the other locations, students have to calculate an extra 200-300 EUR per month.
