

**CEEPUS:**

CEEPUS (Central European Exchange Program for University Studies) is a university exchange initiative in the Danube region, based on an international agreement. It connects universities from member countries to collaborate on joint academic programs, promoting mobility for students and professors. CEEPUS supports these exchanges with mobility grants, leveraging existing connections to create opportunities for joint study programs.

CEEPUS works through academic networks that are thematically organized—so universities collaborate on specific subjects (e.g. architecture). These networks allow for joint programs, summer schools, intensive courses, and especially mobility of students and academic staff.

The **CEEPUS PLANNED network** (SI-2022-02-2627 - PLANNED - Spatial PLANNing EDucation Network; Coordinator at UL FA, Tch. Asst. Mateja Volgemut, PhD) brings together seven higher education institutions from Slovenia, Croatia, Serbia, North Macedonia, Slovakia and Poland that bring together their expertise to tackle the challenges of climate change. The focus is on sustainable mobility, blue-green infrastructure and reuse of space.

### **Basic Eligibility and Mobility Types:**

The CEEPUS program is open to students, teaching staff, and other employees of the Faculty of Architecture. There are two main types of mobility:

1. Network Mobility – conducted within an established and approved CEEPUS network;
2. Freemover Mobility – conducted outside of the networks in which the faculty participates.

Priority is given to mobilities within the **PLANNED network** when awarding scholarships. The CEEPUS program offers the following types of mobility:

- Students (3–10 months): For regular study-related activities.
- Short-Term Students (less than 3 months): For preparing final theses or conducting research.
- Teachers: For teaching staff participating in academic exchange.
- Short-Term University Staff (2–5 working days): For non-teaching university employees.

Additionally, for specific academic activities such as summer schools or workshops, the following mobility options are available:

- Short-Term Excursions (2–5 working days): For student participation in special events like summer schools.
- Short-Term Intensive Courses (minimum 6 days): For students attending concentrated learning events such as workshops or summer schools.

### **To be eligible for CEEPUS mobility, STUDENTS must:**

- Have completed at least two semesters of study;
- Be enrolled full-time at a higher education institution in a CEEPUS member country;
- Receive support from their home institution's network coordinator;
- Be a first- or second-cycle student—eligible for up to 10 months of mobility during their studies; doctoral students have no time restrictions;
- In exceptional cases (e.g., summer schools), shorter mobility periods may be approved with proper justification from the coordinator.

### **To participate as a TEACHER in the CEEPUS program, conditions are:**

- Have the status of an employed teacher;
- Meet no age restrictions;
- Commit to a minimum of 6 teaching or supervisory hours per week.

Important: Freemover teacher mobilities to Slovenia are not eligible.

### **Application deadlines:**

Application deadline for exchange in the winter semester 2026/27 (Freemover\* exchanges until July 1, 2026): **June 1, 2026**

Application deadline for exchange in the summer semester 2026/27 (Freemover\* exchanges until November 1, 2026): **November 1, 2026**

\* 'Freemovers' can only benefit from the CEEPUS exchange on the condition that unused months remain within the network.
